# **Worship Notes**


Today's sermon will focus on persecution, "The Challenge of Chains" (Philippians 1:12-18). At first glance, it may seem incongruous to sing Christmas carols alongside the theme of suffering and persecution. However, these ideas go together quite well. Let's keep in mind several things. First, the joyful celebration of Christmas is often muted for persecuted believers around the world where believers have to celebrate the birth of Jesus with little fanfare and in hiding. Second, it helps us to consider that the angels who "now proclaim Messiah's birth" ("Angels from the Realms of Glory") were singing that message to those under the thumb of the Roman empire as they experienced regular oppression and suffering. Remember that not long after the birth of Christ, Herod would slaughter little boys in an effort to stamp out the Messiah before His reign could begin (Praise God that Herod was unsuccessful!). Third, we recognize that Christmas is often a hard time for us, too, for other reasons. We may not face persecution, but we may face recent losses of family members, a serious illness, wayward children who are absent from the home, and other relational pain or stress.

However, even in light of the difficulties that Christmas brings, we can still sing and rejoice! We can sing, "You give and take away; my heart will choose to say, 'Lord, Blessed be Your Name'" ("Blessed Be Your Name"). As we trust in Jesus, let us joyfully obey the call: "Let us all with one accord sing praises to our heavenly Lord" because of the glorious truth that "with His blood mankind hath bought" ("The First Noel"). Christ purchased a people for Himself, and if you're a follower of Jesus, you can rejoice in being part of the family of God! We can sing and rejoice because even during times of difficulty, "Hope is here" ("Somewhere in Your Silent Night with Silent Night! Holy Night!"). And, at the end of the day, we recognize the truth we'll sing in "Not for a Moment (After All)": "After all, You are constant; after all You are only good. After all You are sov'reign. Not for a moment will You forsake me."

Finally, I wanted to say a special "Thank you!" to the TBC Choir & Orchestra! I cannot adequately express how overjoyed I was by your presentation this past Sunday evening. I have bragged on y'all all week long, and I'm so incredibly thankful for your hard work and dedication. Thanks again!

# **Family Devotional Guide**

### Day 1

- Scripture: Philippians 1:12-14
- **Discussion:** Paul was in the 1<sup>st</sup> generation of persecuted Christians. What lessons do you see here in these three verses? How can/does God use persecution to further the spread of the gospel?

### Day 2

- Scripture: Philippians 1:12-14
- Discussion: As you consider the lessons that we can learn from Paul's persecution, consider also the blessings we now enjoy that others across the world do not have. Spend some time praying for the persecuted church the world over. Pray through these verse, asking God to: 1. advance the gospel through their persecution (v. 12); 2. help others to see that persecution and ask Him to draw attention to Himself through their suffering (v. 13); 3. help other brothers and sisters around them to draw confidence from seeing others suffering and realize that they are not alone and be encouraged by the faith of those around them (v. 14).

### Day 3

- Scripture: Philippians 1:15-18
- Discussion: Ask yourself: Am I following Christ sincerely? Paul was faced with those who were hypocritical. While he rejoiced that at least the message of the gospel went out, he deplored the condition of some of the messengers. Pray for yourself and your pastors, asking God to help us always to be careful to "preach Christ...from good will" (v. 15).
