Worship Notes


I hope you are excited to be in the Lord’s house today as we have gathered to worship Him! What an honor it is to come each week and hear the truth of God’s Word proclaimed and be able to sing truths based on God’s Word! Today is especially momentous in that Bro. Tom will be starting in chapter 1, verse 1 of the book of Philippians in this new verse-by-verse walk through Philippians. We’re praying for the Lord to do great things through the preaching of His Word!

Today’s sermon title is “Servants, Saints, and Salvation,” and our music will hopefully convey the truth that we are saved to serve! The choir will open our service by focusing on the miracle of salvation in **“How Can It Be.”** The Lord has lifted us out of bondage to sin so that we can become His bondservants, and we do so willingly because Christ is worthy of our service! He has set us free! I’m reminded of the line from “And Can It Be,” Charles Wesley’s testimony hymn of his personal salvation: “My chains fell off, my heart was free, I rose, went forth, and followed Thee!” **“Amazing Grace (My Chains Are Gone)”** obviously conveys the same idea that we are set free from sin, and because of being saved by grace (see Ephesians 2:8-9), we recognize the call to serve Him with good works: “For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them” (Ephesians 2:10).

Both **“Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing”** and **“Jesus Saves”** express the idea that we are gratefully indebted to Christ for all that He has done in saving those of us who trust in Christ alone for salvation. They bear the same lyrical expression: “O to grace how great a debtor!” We don’t serve Christ with a “debtor’s ethic” simply trying to “pay Him back,” but we should serve our Lord with an intensity and depth of gratitude that goes far beyond any other earthly compulsion or motive. We should serve Him out of love and with willing hearts! Just as we could never save ourselves (expressed in the hymn **“Not What My Hands Have Done”**), there’s nothing we could ever do that could equal what Christ has done for us! Let us commit, however, to offer up as much praise to Him as we can and do as the hymn states: “I praise the Christ of God; I rest on love divine; And with unfalt’ring lip and heart I call this Savior mine. My Lord has saved my life and freely pardon gives; I love because He first loved me, I live because He lives.”

What comes to your mind when you think of the word “saint?” How is Paul using this word, and how should the fact he calls all believers saints impact our service to Jesus Christ? Day 3 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Scripture: Philippians 1:2; Ephesians 2 Discussion: Grace and peace are important terms for Paul. In Ephesians 2, he fleshes out that we are saved “by grace” (Eph. 2:9). Then, in verse 14, he speaks of Christ Himself as being “our peace” and actually “making peace” (v. 15) between us and God the Father. Consider the implications of us being enemies of God and then being brought near to Him. What does that tell us of the magnitude of God’s grace and the depth of peace we now enjoy?
