## Safeguarding Week 2019

Safeguarding Week 2019 takes place this year from Monday, 24<sup>th</sup> June. – Friday, 28<sup>th</sup> June. This year we want to think about how can we better protect children, young people and vulnerable adults across the District by running public events to raise awareness of Safeguarding issues and to provide information on how they can access support and know who to contact if they have concerns. #### **Designated Safeguarding Officer**

It is recommended that at least one person in your organisation is a 'designated safeguarding officer' (DSO). This person will take the lead on safeguarding for your organisation. This course clarifies the role of designated safeguarding officers, for voluntary and community organisations within Bradford District, who are working with children and young people. The course will be delivered by Taye Training and will be tailored for those working in Bradford Metropolitan District. This course is taking place in Bradford on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> March 10 – 4pm at Manningham Mills, Bradford.

# **Disclosure Barring Service (DBS) Training**

This course is aimed at organisations that work with volunteers or are planning to work with and manage volunteers.
