WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- OLD CARDSTOCK OR CARDBOARD:
 - Something firm to make the stencil with
- AN X-ACTO KNIFE
- A STURDY SURFACE TO CUT ON :
 - A mat or sketchbook so you won't cut the table
- PENCILS & PENS:
 - For drawing and drafting
- PAINT & MARKERS
- SPONGES & PAINT BRUSHES
- TAPE
- PAPER



STEP 1: BRAINSTORM

- THINK OF SOMETHING THAT YOU WANT PEOPLE TO KNOW ABOUT. SOMETHING IMPORTANT. SOMETHING YOU'D LIKE TO SHARE.
- E.G. WHAT MATTERS IN YOUR COMMUNITY?



STEP 2: DRAFT & DRAW

- DRAFT & DRAW YOUR STENCIL ONTO THE CARDSTOCK OR CARDBOARD.
- IT'S OKAY IF YOU MAKE A MISTAKE; YOU CAN CUT OUT/AROUND ANY IMPERFECTIONS.



STEP 3: CUT IT OUT

- CAREFULLY USE YOUR X-ACTO KNIFE TO CUT OUT YOUR STENCIL.
- REMEMBER TO CUT ON TOP OF A SURFACE (LIKE A MAT OR SKETCHBOOK) SO YOU DON'T CUT UP YOUR DESK OR TABLE.



<u>STEP 4: APPLY YOUR</u> <u>STENCIL</u>

- PUT YOUR STENCIL ON THE SURFACE THAT YOU WANT TO APPLY IT TO. USE TAPE SO IT DOESN'T MOVE AROUND.
- USE MARKERS OR PAINT, BUT NOT TOO MUCH OR YOUR IMAGE WILL BLUR. SPONGES > PAINTBRUSHES.
- CAREFULLY REMOVE YOUR STENCIL.




