
#### What does the programme include?

#### 999 Community Volunteer Recruitment Awareness Event

West Yorkshire Police and West Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service are launching the '999 Community Volunteers' scheme. The scheme is less formal than other types of volunteering (such as the Special Constabulary), and volunteers are under no obligation to commit to a certain number of hours.

## What to Do if you have Concerns a Child is at Risk of Harm

New guidance from Bradford Safeguarding Children Board

There have been some important changes as to how agencies should report their concerns about children and young people at risk of harm into Bradford Children's services.

The procedures and guidance were launched by the <u>Bradford Safeguarding Children Board</u> (BSCB) last Thursday. Full details can be found on their website in the <u>'Documents and Resources' section</u>. All local guidance for Safeguarding Children and Young People is summarised in the <u>West Yorkshire Consortium Inter Agency Safeguarding and Child Protection Procedures</u> also found on the BSCB website, where you will also find the latest referral guidance. If you are a Safeguarding Lead or you have a safeguarding responsibility within your setting, please ensure staff are made aware of these important changes.

If you missed our last <u>Young Lives</u> forum, where Cath Knowles, Bradford Children's Services - Improvement Consultant, updated our members on the changes, there will be another opportunity to attend a briefing in Bradford on <u>Friday</u>, <u>13th September</u> which will take you through the new guidance and resources for Bradford's Continuum of Need and Risk Identification Tool.

More than 500,000 people used the website's Journey Planner to co-ordinate almost 1.3m journeys.
