### Would you enjoy 'Giving Back'?

Giving Back– is a 2-year programme funded by Comic Relief based at Womenzone community centre in Bradford. The project involves the recruitment of 50 Community Champion women aged 65+ to set up and run 3 social action groups in family mentoring, a theatre group and a wellbeing group. The project has currently been delivered in Bradford East, sustaining long term participation of the hardest to reach.

The social action groups provide our beneficiaries with the chance to be active, be more involved, and feel valued. This alongside the fact that they enjoy greater levels of empowerment, make new friends and reduce their social isolation to improve their mental health and wellbeing.

Our well-developed Wellbeing Group takes place every Tuesday 10:30 - 14:30 to support people with mental and physical health problems to recover and manage their wellbeing. Creative activities such as, chair exercises, light dance exercises especially designed for their age, Geometrical art, and health workshops take place in the group. We have recently purchased a tennis table to encourage ladies to play tennis to give stimulation to their brains and have fun.

# What is the greatest challenge facing your organisation in the current sector and how could others (organisations or individuals) help you overcome it?

We all know the challenges faced by both the Local Authority and the VCS, money is tight. I fully believe that we can survive by looking at more collaborative work. I come from a voluntary sector background, I know just how determined it is to do the best for the communities of Bradford and we want to help with the next steps of the journey in these financially challenging times. We can link groups and projects together to apply for joint funding. We aim to map VCS provision across the district so that groups can make those links themselves which will reduce duplication at the same time as identifying gaps.

# If you could give one piece of advice to other voluntary/community organisations, what would it be?

Work together. Gone are the days when VCS organisations can work in isolation and hold onto their funding. There just isn't the funding available to allow that any more. Think creatively, use us to enable this. We are a district wide resource and we want to work with you to ensure the continuity of the sector.

A simple way of sharing good food that would otherwise go to waste.

The average <u>UK family wastes £810 a year</u> by throwing away food and drink, and £3 billion is wasted by food sectors. Despite growing awareness of food waste, there are few easy ways for people or businesses to get food near its 'sell by' date to others.

In 2016 we launched a Community Fridge in Derbyshire to redistribute good food to the community. Since then, Community Fridges have popped up across the UK helping thousands connect to their communities, access nutritious food, save money and reduce waste. To connect the projects and exchange support, Hubbub set up the free Community Fridge Network in 2017.
