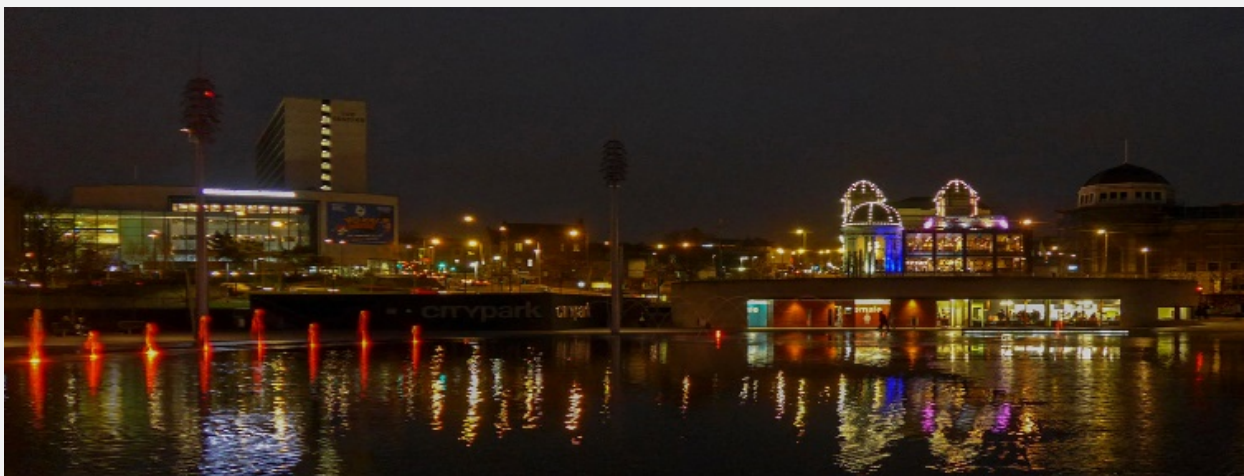

FUNDING

Grants for Unpaid Carers'

Unpaid carers are being urged to contact Carers' Resource to discuss ways to help them improve their health and wellbeing, which could result in a Carer's Wellbeing Grant of up to £150 allocated by Bradford Council, for things such as pamper sessions, short breaks, hobby equipment and sports tickets so carers can improve their own wellbeing and can continue their vital role. Nationwide Building Society – Community Grants.

Grants up to £50,000 for local housing projects to find new approaches to increase the supply of housing or reinvent renting for both tenants and landlords.

Safer Communities Fund.

Grants of up to £5,000 to help voluntary and community groups, charities and partners in West Yorkshire make their communities safer and feel safer

Noel Buxton Trust.

Small, grassroots organisations with charitable status can apply for grants of up to £5,000 for family projects with a focus on domestic abuse or up to £4,000 for rehabilitation of offenders.

Bradford VCS Alliance, Health Messaging small grants Round Two.

Grants of £250 to £750 for community groups to help promote appropriate choices for accessing health care.

Provident Social Impact Fund.

Grants of £1,500 to £5,000 for projects run by community groups with an income under £250,000 and that benefit people in Bradford district.

The fund will run for 12 months and will distribute £40,000 in grants..

"Priority will be given to small, locally-based community organisations in areas of social, financial and welfare disadvantage."

Rank Foundation, Pebble Grants - Small grants for registered charities. If you are raising money for a particular project for which the mainstay is capital costs (building work, refurbishment or the purchase of long-term equipment) or a one-off short-term activity (such as an annual respite break or holiday for disadvantaged young people) and have already raised a third of the total costs, you may be eligible for this. Applications sought for trustee meeting in January 2019.

The Safer Communities Fund offers grants of up to £5,000 to help voluntary and community groups, charities and partners make their communities safer and feel safer.

Grants will be awarded in line with the outcomes and priorities set out in the Police and Crime plan. Projects must take place in West Yorkshire.

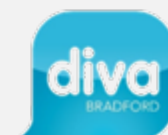

Children's services: Ofsted

Ofsted have published the [report](#) of their recent inspection of Bradford's children's services. The headline finding is that two areas of inspection have been judged as "requires improvement" and one as "inadequate". Public Forum for Education

'City of Research - Tackling Barriers to Learning'

The focus of the next Public Forum for Education will be on how Bradford is using its status as the City of Research to tackle barriers to learning and improve social mobility. The event will be held on Wednesday 28th November (16.30 - 18.30, buffet and registration from 16:00) in the Hockney Conference Room, Margaret McMillan Tower, Bradford BD1 1NN.

Keynote speaker Prof. Mark Mon-Williams will talk about how world class research developed in Bradford is being used with maximum impact to tackle health and social care barriers to learning in these areas. Mark Miller, Head of Bradford Research School at Dixon's Academies, will bring examples of how the evidence from education research is put into practice to improve learning within schools across the District.

Together we will consider the key research questions for Bradford and how findings can be applied to make the most difference to children's life chances.

You will also hear from "Evidence based schools", an initiative launched in Bradford on 25 October 2018 by government minister Nadhim Zahawi, and see how partners are working together in the Opportunity Area to fund local priorities identified by local people. [More information.](#)

COMMUNITY SHOWCASE – TECP

Thorpe Edge Community Project is a unique initiative, housed in the Rockwell Centre, which offers a wide range of activities, groups, services and opportunities for people to improve their lifestyle, their health & sense of wellbeing.

We engage directly with families on low-incomes, children, young people, elderly people, lone parents and disabled people to support them and meet needs. Our approach is holistic and fun. We tackle isolation, encourage social contact, promote physical activities and healthy eating, offer training and volunteering opportunities, involving the community in running the services.

Tell us about your organisation (who you are) –

We are a community development organisation based on the Thorpe Edge estate for 30 years. We originally got funded through the Urban Development Programme, the area was built in the 1950's and was struggling, since the industry collapsed. This led to a lot of poverty, so we got funded through Bradford Council and BCVS to deliver some of the services we now do, we help local people to help themselves in very difficult services. Our whole philosophy is to work with local people to set up groups, projects and services to meet local need, all of our services have grown out of what the local people feel they want – it is a truly grassroots project. We are happy to do this because the need is constantly changing e.g. a massive need was previously housing however this is less of a crisis now – one of the things we now do is a Food Bank to meet the current needs in the area.

Why was the organisation founded (what was the initial aim/need) –

High unemployment, poverty, social dislocation etc led to us being established, when the industry and economy collapsed, community became the 'social cement' and this brought, and keeps, local people together.

Tell us about your service, what do you get up to, what do you offer and to whom –

The essence of our service is that we work with all ages and abilities, we primarily target vulnerable people who have social issues, mental health issues, are bereaved, are struggling to find employment or housing. For example we have a Craft Group, led by a woman whose husband passed away. She established the group to help people who have lost family or may need support to cope with their situation ie those with Dementia. We also have a Soft Furnishings group which helps people to engage and brings them out of social isolation, it leads to other things such as the Community Choir or our Coffee Mornings. These groups all work together to meet the local need.

We also try to develop Community Based Social Enterprises such as the Newlands Community Furniture Service which we established. This is now doing really well.

We try to build confidence and self-esteem and help people to become community leaders – this is what makes us special, we're not simply delivering services, we're trying to empower people to change their own community. For example we run children's groups which are to empower the next generation, inspire them to do more and be more, change their future and their communities – watching them take on responsibility and undergo change is really inspiring to us.

We also try to develop Community Based Social Enterprises such as the Newlands Community Furniture Service which we established. This is now doing really well.

What are you most proud of about your organisation –

We are really proud that we are able to make a difference to people's lives in this community, a lot of different people have come into the Centre and their lives have been changed. We work with such a large, diverse range of people come into our Centre and we have multi-faceted approach to community development. We have a lot of different connections and links to the community so we get a whole host of information that we can put to use.

Tell us about a time you worked collaboratively in the district, what was the outcome –

We work collaboratively in everything we do; we are working with Ravenscliffe Community Association on a Cooking Project. This is working really well and we have one of our staff members out doing this kind of activity all the time. This project is really taking off. We also work with Newlands Community Association to get outside of our circle, accessing wider networks and sharing our own. We work with the local doctors practice to provide a social prescribing service, this is working really well and effectively targeting a lot of people in need with this service.

What is your greatest challenge and how could others help you overcome it –

Finance is our greatest challenge; we are struggling to be sustainable in the sector. The community needs are existing and new needs are constantly popping up, we need to be able to access funding to be able to provide this service. Without this vital funding, we will need to restrict the services we can offer, meaning community needs will struggle to be met.

Have you received any support from Community Action along the way? Bfunded, DIVA, training, VOSO etc. What did you receive and what was the outcome?

We use bfunded and DIVA as well as a VOSO, we work quite closely with Clive. We really like these services, DIVA especially is really good for communicating our job vacancies, it really gets the message out. Clive helps to give a wider view of what is happening across Bradford, he can offer this perspective because of his wide community links, it helps us to understand the voluntary sector.

OPPORTUNITIES

WORKSHOPS – POP: Preparation, Opportunities & Progression

'POP' consists of 8 Creative Sessions focusing on Team Building Skills and is aimed at young people aged 16-25 and those with barriers to education, training and employment. We are also offering this as an accredited course to young people who are working or wish to work within the youth sector. FREE Report: A strategy for tackling loneliness

A report titled 'A Connected Society: a Strategy for Tackling Loneliness - laying the foundations for change', published on 15 October, is the first [strategy](#) for tackling loneliness in England.

It marks a shift in the way we see and act on loneliness, both within government and across society. It builds on years of work by many individuals and organisations, and acts as the government's first major contribution to the national conversation on loneliness and the importance of these social connections. This strategy is an important first step, but the government is also committed to long-lasting action to tackle the problem of loneliness.

Understanding SPICE: Training

Spice (Synthetic Cannabinoid Receptor Agonists) is more prevalent than ever before and on the rise in your local area. The drug poses a unique set of problems to a community with the key demographic using Spice being those with complex multiple needs; this combination is a serious concern to both general public and front-line health and social care staff.

Waypoint (formally known as Project 6 Training), have worked closely with Sheffield City Council to develop a training package that delivers a comprehensive guide to Spice, its effects on the brain and impact on the wider community.

There is an upcoming Open Course - Understanding Spice Use in West Yorkshire. The training is informative, interactive and fun and you'll leave feeling much more confident in your knowledge of Spice and how to respond. For further information look at our [flyer](#).
