The Women's Holiday Centre

The Women's Holiday Centre is for women, with or without children, on their own, or with friends. Women from all walks of life are welcome and visit regularly. The house offers a safe and friendly environment, where women and children can feel at home and get to know each other. Items such as towels, toiletries, and both adult and children's spare coats/hats/gloves/wellies etc. are kept at the house so that those using public transport have less to carry. We're at the start of the main path up Pen-y-Ghent, and are surrounded by beautiful countryside, so it's an ideal place for walking and/or relaxing. We're a vegetarian household so please do not bring any meat or fish onto the premises, and only dogs who are accredited by Assistance Dogs UK can come.

The part B&B, part hostel style accommodation consists of a mix of private and shared bedrooms, plus two sitting rooms, a large playroom, large kitchen and garden. There is a very relaxed and informal self-catering arrangement, with vegetarian and vegan food provided, and women often cook and eat together. During mid-week term-times, the house can offer a quiet place that can be ideal for women recovering from various illnesses or stresses. We offer "3 nights for the price of 2" mid-week during term time, and also have occasional work weeks where you can arrange to volunteer in exchange for a free stay.

It costs £25 per person per night to accommodate people, and we have a sliding scale for those who cannot afford this. We ask women to total up all of their income, including housing benefit, any tax credits, Universal Credit and income from employment, when working out where they are on the sliding scale. Children stay at half-price or less. Groups (both formal organised groups, or groups of friends) may also book the whole house, closing it to other visitors. This must be for a minimum of two nights if it is at the weekend. You can find further details, including about the sliding scale on our [website](#).

Violence and Exploitation

A number of reports on violence and criminal exploitation:

- Protecting young people from serious violence: The Home Affairs Select Committee's report on the government's serious violence strategy, describes it as 'a completely inadequate response' to problems like county lines and knife crime.
- Homeless young people's vulnerability to violence and exploitation: Centrepont research.
- Families of criminally exploited children are being failed: Missing People 'sinterviews with the families of children who have gone missing and been the victims of criminal exploitation
- New report from the Centre of Expertise on Child Abuse demonstrates that there is significant scope to improve the detail and consistency of data collected about child sexual abuse.
