The Big Picture

Paul and Silas, along with their mission partners Timothy and Luke, were sent by the Jerusalem congregation on a mission trip. In the Roman colony of Philippi, the mission team was confronted by a demon-possessed slave girl. When God used Paul to cast the demon out, the slave girl's masters had Paul and Silas brutally beaten and thrown into prison. While in prison, God caused an earthquake that released their bonds, and when the jailer saw the doors open, he planned to kill himself. Paul stopped him and shared the Gospel with him. That night, the jailer and his family were baptized, and the next morning Paul and Silas were set free.


