Pentecost Acts 2:1–24 **AD 33**

The Big Picture

Ten days after Jesus' ascension, His followers were all together in Jerusalem in one place, worshiping. Suddenly, a sound from heaven like a mighty rushing wind filled the house, fire from heaven descended, and fiery supernatural tongues rested on each of the heads of the disciples. Filled with the promised Holy Spirit, they began to speak in a multitude of languages (which they did not know), proclaiming the Gospel message. Jews from all over the Roman world were gathered there for the festival of Pentecost, and each one heard the Gospel message in his or her own language! Some people made fun of the disciples, saying they had too much to drink, but Peter set them straight. This was a miracle of God that would culminate in the Baptism of three thousand people in the name of Jesus.
