Other materials

- World atlas. (Highly recommended is the *National Geographic World Atlas for Young Explorers*)
- National Geographic* or *Scholastic News* magazines (or similar nature magazines).
- Children's encyclopedia such as *The New Book of Knowledge*.
- Puzzle maps of the United States and of the World.
- Standard classroom globe with latitude and longitude lines.
- Inflatable topographic globe, 27 inches in diameter, with oceans clear or blue. Does not need to show countries. Must show major latitude and longitude lines and some physical features of the continents. Should have equator and tropics clearly marked. Polar circles may need to be added using permanent marker (this should be done before giving the globe to the student).
- State or local city map with grid lines.
- Small lamp without a shade.
- 12-inch ruler
- Yard stick
- Magnetic compass with directions clearly marked.
- Colored pencils
- Dark permanent marker
- Masking tape
- Clear tape
- Colored clay
