Please ensure the student understands the information below in language appropriate for the student.

PREREQUISITE: Ability to read and write printed (manuscript) writing.

HOW TO DO THIS COURSE: Do the steps one at a time, in order. When you finish a step, put your initials and the date on the sign-off line on the right. A split line means to get a pass (and an initial) from another student (or your Supervisor if it says that). A * means get a checkout. All written work (including drills) is turned in to the Supervisor.

PURPOSE: Learn to read and write cursive handwriting at a beginning level.

ESTIMATED TIME: 2–4 months part time.

MATERIALS NEEDED TO DO THIS COURSE —

Lined writing paper (7/8 to 1 inch), a big pencil with soft lead, clay. Access to commercial cursive handwriting drill books.

NOTE TO THE SUPERVISOR-

The student should drill until he easily uses the proper formation of each letter. Additional drill sheets available from commercial cursive handwriting books are highly recommended to ensure adequate drilling is done. There may be some minor differences between the way the letters are formed in this course and in other commercial cursive writing materials. Use the formation that makes sense to you. Be sure to observe the student as he forms the letters initially. Then continue to observe that he maintains proper formation of the letters. If the student has difficulty mastering a particular letter, here are some suggestions: 1) check body position and posture, including correct pencil grip, 2) demonstrate for him how to form the letter, 3) watch him make the letter in clay with correct formation. If the student has trouble reading cursive letters, have him drill reading a set of flash cards that contain one cursive letter per card (set to contain lower case and upper case).

A. THE CURSIVE ALPHABET

- 1. READ: Data Sheet #4623 Cursive Handwriting, section "The Cursive Alphabet" to heading "Writing Position".
- DEMONSTRATE (with whatever objects you wish to use): What 2. cursive handwriting is.
- 3. DEMONSTRATE: Point out to another student some of the ways cursive letters are similar to printed letters, and some of the ways they are different from printed letters.

B. WRITING POSITION

- *1. READ: Data Sheet #4623, section "Writing Position".
 - 2. DEMONSTRATE: With your body, do these steps.
 - a) Show the best way to sit when you write cursive.
 - b) Show the best way to hold your pencil when you write cursive.

- 3. DEMONSTRATE (with objects): The two motions you use with your arm to make letters.
- 4. DEMONSTRATE: Sharpen your pencil. Make a mark with it and keep going over and over it until the line your pencil marks gets wide. Look at the point of your pencil. Does it have a flat spot? Turn the pencil so the flat spot is up. Does the pencil make a thinner line again?

C. LEARNING TO WRITE IN CURSIVE

- 5. DRILL: On tracing paper, practicing making hooks. Then make them on lined writing paper or in a cursive handwriting drill book. Do this until you can do it easily. **Supervisor pass.**
