The script used by the children was worthy of the Vatican far less a primary school in Scotland.** The performance of the readers, the actors and the singers exceeded what might reasonably expected of children of their individual age. The school community of the school excelled overall. All the teachers and assistants were invited onto the Sanctuary/stage to be affirmed in their sacred ministry of teaching by the applause of the community. Mrs Oates was presented with a sumptuous bouquet of flowers by the parish as a sign of our appreciation of her and her colleagues' commitment to Catholic Education.

This is part of the bishop's Christmas letter to all priests and to all parishes in the Diocese:

Pope Francis wrote a lovely letter recently to us all from the Shrine of the Nativity at Greccio, the site of the First Christmas Crib set up by St Francis of Assisi in December 1223. He concluded his reflections on the beauty of the Christmas Crib as follows:

"Dear Brothers and Sisters, the Christmas Crib is part of the precious but demanding process of passing on the faith. Beginning in childhood and at every stage of our lives, it teaches us to contemplate Jesus, to experience God's love for us, to feel and believe that God is with us and that we are with him, his children, Brothers and Sisters all. We give thanks to that child who is Son of God and Son of the Virgin Mary, and realise that in this knowledge we find true happiness. Like St Francis [of Assisi] may we open our hearts to this simple grace, so that from our wonderment a humble prayer may arise, a prayer of thanksgiving to God, who willed to share with us his all, and thus never to leave us alone."


