Our spiritual, sacramental and pastoral life in St. Brendan's.

Sung Response to the Psalm today [as last Sunday]: "May the house of the Lord be at peace."

First Sunday of Advent and first day of the Church's liturgical year.

Advent: translated from the Latin word *Advenire*, it means that Jesus <u>comes to</u> each one of us personally and not merely that he comes into the world.

We encounter Jesus in two ways - by Word [the Scriptures] and by the grace which flows from the seven Sacraments of the Church especially participation in the Eucharist each Sunday. There is no other way.

Notice the changes to mark the Season of Advent

- 1. The set of purple and pink candles and the Wreath, the Advent water all are blessed today.
- 2. Purple vestments and purple banners, no flowers until the Christmas Vigil.
- 3. The new hymn book Catholic Hymns Old & New is in use here from today.
- 4. The Gloria is omitted from Mass until the Christmas Vigil.
- 5. The passages of Scripture focus until 18th December on the second coming of Jesus at the end of time, not of his natural birth in a stable in Bethlehem. He is our Saviour and Redeemer.
- 6. Peter McMillan will speak today about deepening his understanding of his faith through our Wednesday evening sessions and the personal impact of this in his life, day to day.
- 7. The stall now provides many spiritual resources to help us understand better both the Season of Advent and our Catholic faith. The magazine Advent Extra is very imaginative with something for all ages. Please look there and see for yourself.
- 8. The Parish will give children books and symbols through the Children's Liturgy for home. Teenagers will be offered separate resources. Each family will receive an Advent Calendar.
- 9. <u>The Advent Challenge</u>: take a free copy of Matthew's Gospel at the Stall and read a chapter of it each day. This Gospel will be used throughout next year Year A of the 3-year cycle.
- 10. During Holy Hour we will pray and meditate on the fourteen Stations of the Infancy Narrative. Fr. Denis McBride composed these and his summary of Matthew's Gospel in the special Diary for 2020 (the Gospel to be used next year) is worth buying to have the benefit of it alone.

The Children's Liturgy during Advent AND Sacramental Preparation: Bishop Toal has written once again to all priests and all Head Teachers with amended guidelines on the celebration of Confirmation. He seems very concerned about the standard of preparation he sometime encounters. He makes the same point year on year.

We want to set a solid foundation from Primary 1 to Primary 6/7 for the three Sacraments celebrated in Primary School. Fr. Ness will meet with families on *Sunday 19th January at 2pm* in the church to review the preparation by P3 & P4 children since August. Advent has a special place in this preparation. We want to help the children in age groups to grasp the mystery of the birth of Jesus at Christmas.

Participation Record Cards <u>for parents to use will be distributed today in the Hall after Mass to let them record for themselves their participation in this Parish between now and the meeting on 19th January.</u>

Families not from this parish who won't take part in our programs but who attend St. Brendan's PS should speak to the priests in their own parishes to arrange to celebrate the Sacraments there. Children of families from this parish who don't participate in the Advent and later programs will not be refused the opportunity for Sacraments, but dates for this will be set as and when participation is established. *Celebrating Sacraments requires participation in the sacramental life and the pastoral life of the parish.*

PARISH AND PARISHIONERS.

Bambinelli [beautiful infant children] Sunday - 15th **December:** look at the poster on the Notice Board at the entrance to the church. It is a celebration by Pope Francis in which he blesses the figure of the baby Jesus which will be used in the crib. **Our children by God's Providence are to lead the morning Mass that day and we will follow the example of the Holy Father with our very beautiful children**.

The Ecumenical Service to celebrate St. Andrew's Feast Day with parishioners in St. Margaret's was held last Sunday. Many members of both communities attended and considered in prayer the call of Andrew to become a follower of Jesus with their own call to follow him. Hospitality was provided generously to us and we will meet with that community again when they come here for a joint Christmas Carol Concert on 15th December at 6pm. We ask our many families with children to bring the children to take a lead part.

On Tuesday: Anne Marie Canavan will again serve as lay Leader at the Liturgy of the Word and distribution of Holy Communion. Anne Marie understood like Evelyn, Elspeth and Margaret, this isn't so much a question of "can I do this?" but rather " ...does God want me to do this for the good of the St. Brendan's community?"

Each Wednesday we celebrate Mass in our Hall followed immediately by hospitality. The ladies who arrange this hospitality will provide a Christmas Coffee and Tea after the Mass on 11th December and then take a well-deserved break until after the New Year. *Please note that the importance of this liturgy in our sacramental, pastoral and social life means that funerals won't ordinarily be arranged on Wednesdays*

Wednesday evening Faith development at 7pm:

The Pope has set Sunday 26th January as a special day to emphasise the provision of Faith Development . The Church knows how desperately she needs to improve the level of knowledge we have of our faith which is under attack daily from outside the Church. Many people don't know how to respond when asked questions about their faith and practice. This meeting and the subjects explained each week gives you the chance to improve this knowledge

Wedding Anniversary: on Thursday evening we celebrated the diamond wedding anniversary of Jim and Anne McKenzie <u>with Mass in their home surrounded by their family</u>. **Our fondest congratulations to you both!!** All families with a significant marriage anniversary celebration in prospect can have this at home.

Baptisms celebrated during Advent in a situation of pastoral need. One family has arranged a baptism just before Christmas. This will follow immediately after the wedding of the parents on the same day. It will be a double celebration for this community as we encourage couples who are free to marry to come and discuss and plan for this in 2020 and also encourage couples who have married in ceremonies outside of the Church *to ask about convalidation - making their civil marriage lawful under the Code of Canon Law*.
