

## **Emperor Akihito thanks** Japanese in farewell and prays for peace

**April 30, 2019** 

Japanese Emperor Akihito, in his final remarks as his three-decade reign drew to a close on Tuesday, thanked the people for their support and expressed hope for a peaceful future.

<ul> <li>marginalize: to relegate to a lower or outer edge, as of specific groups of people</li> <li>We must not marginalize the poor in our society.</li> </ul>
□ abdication: a formal resignation and renunciation of powers □ unprecedented: never having happened or existed before • The government took the unprecedented step of releasing confidential correspondence.
<b>stunned</b> : very shocked or upset, especially so that you are unable to act normally • <i>I was stunned when I heard the tragic news</i> .

surgery: medical treatment in which a doctor cuts open someone's body
prostate: the organ in a man's body that produces a liquid that combines with and carries sperm
prostate cancer: cancer of the prostate gland
sympathize: to behave in a kind way and show that you understand someone's problems; to

<b>conservative</b> : not willing to accept much change, especially in the traditional values of society
• He's a serious person who's very conservative in his opinions.
<b>object to</b> : to oppose, disagree with, or disapprove of someone or something.
• My parents have always objected to the women I date, so I just don't tell them about my love life
anymore.  Troyal: a member of a royal family
<b>heir</b> : someone who will receive money, property, or a title when another person dies
• The crown princess is expected to bear an heir to the throne.
enthrone: to seat ceremonially on a throne; to make someone the new king, queen in a formal
ceremony
enthronement: the ceremony of installing a new monarch
reign: to officially rule a country
• In Great Britain the queen reigns, but doesn't govern.
<b>lawmaker</b> : a politician whose job is to help to make the laws of a country or state
sweep under the rug: to conceal something in the hopes it won't be discovered by others
• The mayor swept all of his dirty deals under the rug.
<b>pass</b> : to make a law, proposal, etc. become official, usually by voting to accept it
• This is one of the worst laws ever passed.
<b>emeritus</b> : honorably retired from assigned duties and retaining your title along with the
additional title 'emeritus' as in 'professor emeritus'; 'retired from assigned duties' need not imply
that one is inactive
• emeritus professor of physics
