

FINAL RESULTS

uComms conducted a survey of 2,124 residents across Australia during the night of 12 March 2019.

Question 1:

The Bureau of Meteorology reports Australia has just experienced the hottest summer on record and a range of severe global warming impacts such as heatwaves, floods, bushfires and prolonged drought.

Thinking about your vote at the next federal election, how important is it to you that political leaders commit to immediately taking serious action to tackle climate change?
