

As we enter November, our church and culture focuses on major holidays that demand great energies as we celebrate. Thanksgiving is a time to gather as family and friends. We plan for where we will celebrate, how will we decorate, are there travel demands, are we responsible for cooking, and if we are a guest, what do we bring for our hosts. The biblical New Testament word for giving is "Dosis." It means the act of giving or the act of giving one's self to the needs of another. The word "Donor" comes from this Greek word. This dependence on thanks and giving is why I believe we love the celebrations of November and December.

CONSECRATION SUNDAY IS COMING

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God, by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

Our congregation's Generosity Team has selected the *New Consecration Sunday* Stewardship Program as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. *New Consecration Sunday* encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, November 10, 2019, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every guest and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We also urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team, our church Elders, Deacons and Trustees. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.

PROFILE OF A PRESBYTERIAN WOMAN—RUTH THOMAS

Her tee shirt featuring a sparkly sewing machine states, "My machine is calling, I must sew." This message defines our own Ruth Thomas, seamstress extraordinaire! Leading a group of dedicated sewers, Ruth is the inspiration and backbone of our Presbyterian Women's Quilting Circle.

Ruth's lifelong love of all needlework began in the mill town of Lorain, Ohio, nicknamed "The Steel Town," which is located on Lake Erie, 30 miles from Cleveland. Her family of seven included her three brothers and one sister. Lorain, home of famed Poet Laureate, Toni Morrison, and is best known worldwide for its steel mills that employed both her



parents. The family attended the Christian Temple Disciples of Christ where Ruth was in the youth group. During this time, she found a talent and a passion for sewing —even creating her prom dress for high school graduation!

After a brief time working at the mill, the allure of southern Florida drew young Ruth and a neighbor friend to relocate to Ft. Lauderdale where she found work at Circle K, rising to manager. There she met and married her husband, Richard. Their daughter Alissa was born and the family moved with Richard's transfer to Vero Beach. Always busy, Ruth worked as Membership secretary at Community Church for several years as well as working for a food distribution service and later starting a home cleaning business. During her time at Community Church, she worked closely with First Presbyterian member, Patti Franz, and also met the then FPC Associate Pastor Fred Foy. With Patti's encouragement, Ruth joined our church's crafting group and that led to the Thomas family becoming members in 2006.

Ruth found a home in FPC with the crafting and sewing ladies group. When JoAnn Wheeler asked the crafting group to make items for the Abraham Kriel Children's Home in Potchefstoom, So. Africa, the group became firmly established in their mission project. As their sewing began to diversify, former member Sharon Tar taught the group quilting skills. With this new direction, they made and auctioned a quilt at the annual Presbyterian Women's Christmas Tree Lane fundraiser. Later this core group helped organize the first ever Quilt Show held in McAfee Hall.
