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Welcome

Judo ACT invites you to the 2022 Canberra International Open and Canberra Open being held 18 to 20 February 2022. The Open will be followed by a JA training camp with the presence of gold medallist from the recent Tokyo Olympics (tbc).

Venue

Australian Institute of Sport (AIS), Combat Centre Leverrier St, Bruce Canberra.

Eligibility

All Australian players must be financial members of a Judo Australia (JA) member State or Territory.

All International players must be International Judo Federation (IJF) affiliated and organise their own visa.

The AIS requires all competitors, officials, spectators and supporters to be double vaccinated against COVID-19.

Rules

- The Tournament will be run in accordance with the JA Sporting Code.
- The IJF Refereeing Rules will be applied.

Approved exceptions to the JA Sporting Code for this Tournament include:

- Minimum grade levels. A minimum grade of 4th kyu (Orange Belt) is required.

Judogi Control

- Blue and white Judogis shall be worn in all divisions.
- Cadet, Junior and Senior competitors are to ensure that their Judogi complies with the Judogi rules as per attachment 11 in the JA Sporting Code.

Draw

The draw for all divisions will be conducted on completion of the official weigh-ins.

Subject to entries, Event Management may apply absolute discretion to combine divisions, not run divisions, or use a pools system.

NOTE: The Australian National Points Table will be used to seed the Cadet, Junior and Senior competitors. Maximum separation by State and Clubs will be applied to the Senior Boys and Senior Girls divisions where possible.

Ticketing and Spectators

To ensure COVID requirements, and minimal seating, a limited number of spectator tickets are now available for sale and purchase for specific competition sessions. Tickets need to be purchased online via the Revolutionise system <https://www.revolutionise.com.au/judoact/events/126032/>. No cash entry fee and no electronic facilities are available at the venue.

Note: The AIS requires that all spectators must be double vaccinated against COVID-19.





Spectator entry on the day will only be permitted with the presentation of a paid invoice of a spectator ticket. No tickets can be purchased at the door.

Spectators will only be able to access designated seating areas within the venue and will not be allowed in the competition or warm up areas.

AIS Accommodation

A limited number of beds have been secured for judo for the competition days. If interested, get in early and by 4 February 2022 to secure AIS accommodation that includes meals.

AIS check in time is 1pm and check out time is 10am.

COVID-19

This event is subject to all COVID-19 related regulations, guidelines and directions of the Australian Government, ACT Government, AIS and other public health authorities. The Judo ACT COVID Safe Event Plan identifies and seeks to minimise the risks posed by COVID-19 to our competitors, coaches, officials, volunteers, spectators, families and the broader community. The COVID Safe Event Plan will be posted on the Judo ACT website.

Additionally, the AIS mandates entry to the facilities if users/patrons:

- have received two doses of an approved COVID-19 vaccine: and
- demonstrate they have received two doses of an approved COVID-19 vaccine in accordance with the ASC's requirements for evidence of vaccination: or
- received an exemption from the ASC.

DURING THE EVENT REQUIREMENTS

- Wash/sanitise your hands regularly
- Competitors should wash and disinfect their hands and feet regularly
- No handshake - greet each other with a bow
- Wear a mask at all times (exceptions: masks are not obligatory on the Field of Play tatami, on the warm-up tatami whilst warming up). Masks must be worn in indoor areas at all times, except when eating
- Maintain 1.5 m distance at all times, except for competitors during training, their contests and during warming up with ONE PARTNER
- Only use the warm up area (Gold Room) on the day of your competition.
- Submit yourselves to contactless temperature measurement. Anyone registering a high temperature will be asked to remain outside and the Doctor will be contacted to make a decision

Insurance

All JA State and Territory associations are responsible for ensuring that their competitors, officials, and volunteers are covered by all relevant insurances through JA or other appropriate insurance arrangements as sanctioned by JA. All international competitors and officials must also ensure they hold appropriate insurance coverage for the event.

It is the responsibility of the individual to ensure that in addition to the normal insurance, they have sufficient insurance in place to cover any COVID-19 related costs. The organiser of the event accepts no liability for any claims relating to cancellation of the event due to COVID-19 or medical costs for any COVID-19 related illness that may affect an individual person during the event.

Medical

By entering, competitors assure that they comply with all medical requirements as outlined in the JA Sporting Code and IJF Refereeing Rules. In entering the competition, each competitor is required to certify a series of medical and health matters as part of the registration process.

Individuals (competitors, spectators, volunteers and officials) are not to attend the competition if they:

- are unwell
- have COVID-19 symptoms, such as fever or chills, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, new loss of smell or taste, runny or blocked nose.

Athlete accreditation collection

The control of entries and issuing of accreditation cards will take place at the AIS Friday 18 February 2022 from 14.00 to 15.00 and Saturday 19 February 2022 from 13.00 to 14.00.

Athletes (15 years and older) must be able to provide identification, including proof of age during accreditation.

Veterans competing in senior women divisions

Veterans competing in senior women divisions may be subject to random weight checks before the start of competition on Sunday 20 February 2022.





The random weigh-in will take place one hour before the start of the competition lasting 45 minutes. The weight of the athlete cannot be more than 5% higher than the official maximum weight limit of the category. The drawn athletes will be given only one chance for an unofficial weigh in.

If over the limit the athlete will not be allowed to take part in the competition and the athlete's opponent will go onto the tatami where they will be declared the winner by fusen-gachi.

Photos and Filming

Photos and filming of athletes may be taken by Judo ACT during the competition and these images may be placed on the internet and/or social media channels.

Referee and Coach meeting

A referee briefing meeting will be held at the AIS Friday, Bronze Room, 18 February 2022 from 3.00pm to 5.00pm.

Key referees will be available from 5.00pm to 5.30pm to brief coaches of the newly introduced IJF rules

Coach Accreditations

Each club will receive accreditations based on the number of Club entries. Collection of coach accreditations will take place at the AIS Friday 18 February 2022 from 14.00 to 15.00 and Saturday 19 February 2022 from 13.00 to 14.00.
