Robbie Gordon is a theatre-maker born in Prestonpans specialising in making work with and for communities. He trained at the RCS graduating in 2016 with the Drama in Education Award. He is the Creative Engagement Director at the Traverse Theatre.

Jack Nurse is a director and theatre-maker who trained at RCS and the National Theatre Studio Directors' Course. Jack was recently an Origins Artist with Headlong (2021-2) and is currently Creative Engagement Director at the Ayr Gaiety, Artist in Residence (Creative Development) at the Traverse Theatre and artistic lead of the international participatory project Positive Stories for Negative Times.

Together they are the joint co-Founders & Artistic Director of Wonder Fools.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION



The production can be adapted to be presented in a non-theatre space such as a gym or a five-a-side pitch. For theatre spaces:

Staffing

We require 3 Technicians for Sound, AV & Projection set up and 2 Stage Technicians for building the set. Show Call 1 x Venue Duty Technician. Our Deputy Stage Manager will cue both.

Staging

The seating configuration should be End On The show requires an ideal minimum playing space of 12 meters width downstage of the Pros x 9 meters depth and a minimum grid height of 6 meters. See Images at the bottom for what the set looks like. We will require you to provide the following; A black stage floor. Black box masking. Flying: stage or fly floor venue dependent, operated by our Stage Manager from stage level.

Sound

We will require you to provide the following; Comms: 2x pack/headset in control room (DSM + Operator) 1x wireless pack onstage for Stage Manager (If wireless comms unavailable then we will require packs SR and SL with long cables) FOH PA – Left, Right, Sub, Side Left + Right, Rear Left + Right. We will bring; Behringer X-32 sound desk. Auditorium position is not required however desk must be situated near Qlab playback. This system will need to tie in to in-house PA. Stage box (please advise if shielded CAT5 run from control to stage is available) 5x handheld radio mics and mic stands (3 licenced, 2 free freq.) 2x Alto active speakers for onstage. The show is programmed on QLab 4.

Lighting

The show has been plotted on a Gio@5 and we will be bringing a show file, please let us know if an EOS system is not available. There will be flashing lights and strobe. We require a hazer and ability to isolate space for haze. We require you to provide the generic lighting units that are on the plan.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION



As shown on the plan, there will be 2 tiers of PARcans at 4.5m and 5m. The upper layer can be rigged directly onto bar, with a 4m long bar rigged underneath for the lower layer. The show is programmed with 3 universes of DMX. Universe 1 – House Dimmers + FoH intelligent lighting Universe 2 – Overhead/ Counterweight intelligent lighting Universe 3 – Floor panel units. We will bring; 8x Robe Robin 600 LED Wash 3x Axcor 300 Wash 12x Prolights StudioCOB LEDs 4x Briteq Powermatrix 5x5 RGB Rigging equipment and 6-way power bar for lower bar of PARcans.

Transport

7 ½ Ton Truck, please let us know if we are not able to have a parking space once the van is unloaded.

Wardrobe & Dressing Rooms

We will require two dressing rooms, with access to showers. We would also appreciate the use of a Laundry facilities during our visit. We would appreciate access to a sink and a fridge.

Front of House

Front of House Clearance is required directly to our Stage Manager/ Deputy Stage Manager. With regards all the above, our Stage Manager should be considered as the main point of contact for any FOH enquiries.
