

A beautifully printed bibliography with specimens, leaves, and sections tipped- and bound-in. Portfolio with a quantity of ephemera, sample leaves and sections, prospectuses, posters, etc., including the large accordion-folded "Bird & Bull Chronological Type Specimen List." The second in a series of bibliographies issued by the Press, this volumes provides entries for 1980-1988. Berger A46.

A beautifully printed bibliography with many specimen leaves, tipped- and bound-in. A significant quantity of ephemera, sample leaves, illustrations, prospectuses, posters, etc. laid into the portfolio. This third Bird & Bull bibliography (following "Twenty-One Years of Bird & Bull" and "Thirty Years of Bird & Bull") provides entries for 1988-2001. A fantastic bibliography from one of the most esteemed modern presses.



Bound as issued in cloth-backed marbled paper over boards; spine titled in gold; spine a trifle darkened; gift inscription on the front pastedown; also the leather bookplate of Estelle Doheny on the front pastedown (this volume was in the late 1980s auction of her extraordinary collection administered by Christie, Manson and Wood). Beautiful opening page color illustration and hand illuminated initials and decorations throughout by Angelo. In publisher's slipcase, a trifle rubbed. This is not to be confused with the larger format Book of Ruth issued by the Grabhorn Press in 1926. GB 97; BCC 28.



A clean, bright copy. The third in a series of five Cadenza Reprints on Typography. A beautiful reprint of Walker and Morris's celebrated essay on printing delivered at the inaugural exhibition by the Arts & Crafts Exhibitions Society in 1888. Morris and Walker went on to begin the most influential private press in modern times. Walker was intimately connected with the Kelmscott Press and its type design in addition to his own collaborative venture with Cobden-Sanderson, the Doves Press.



Holland-backed boards titled in black on the front board; printed in red and black in Morris's Golden type; full-page woodcut after drawings by Gaskin fronting each of the twelve months along with 10-line floriated initial; leather bookplate of Estelle Doheny on the front pastedown; light offsetting from it to the front free endpaper; foxing to the spine and a bit to the top-edge of the textblock; very little foxing in the text. With 225 copies printed on paper, this is among the smaller limitations that the Press issued. Gordon Ray suggests that Gaskin's "twelve designs are perhaps the most successful of Kelmscott Press illustrations"; an assertion with which Colin Franklin agrees. A very nice copy of an uncommon Kelmscott title. Now housed in a custom clamshell box. Peterson A44; Ray 259; Franklin p.43.



As issued in orange, flexible vellum in marbled paper slipcase (lightly rubbed at the extremities); top edge is rough gilt; Dutch gilt endpapers; three striking engravings by Mrozewski illustrate "Kubla Khan," "Christabel," and "The Ancient Mariner." A remarkably bright copy; endpapers are a bit rubbed; cockling to the pastedowns, as usual, and offsetting to the first and last blanks, but unlike most copies the remainder of the text is clean and without significant foxing. A very nice copy of this wonderful production by the Nonesuch Press. Ransom 105.


[OFFICINA BODONI] THE TEMPEST

[8, (blank)], 152, [8, (blank)] pp. Limited Edition, one of 224 copies printed on Fabriano hand-made paper and bound into light green vellum over boards with black morocco title label on the spine and publisher's device stamped in gold on the front cover. A remarkably clean copy with only minor mellowing to the vellum and a thin darkening at the front joint. House in a later green cloth portfolio inserted into a quarter leather slipcase with raised bands, tastefully tooled in gold and blind. The green crushed morocco has evenly toned to brown on the slipcase back (less evenly on the sides). A beautiful enclosure for a stunning edition of The Tempest. This copy belonged to noted bibliophile, Judge Willis Vickery and bears his bookplate on the front pastedown.

In the middle of the 20th century, Giovanni Mardersteig's Officina Bodoni was among of the greatest private presses operating on the continent and far and away the longest running; the quality of the work it issued put it on par with Kelmscott and Doves Presses. But where Mandersteig distinguished himself from the likes of Morris and Cobden-Sanderson was his broader view of the printer's tasks--a passion for perfection without hobbling himself by dogmatic adherence to a single "ideal book"; he strove to present each book in the form to which it was most suited. Elegantly printed in black Bodoni Catania 16 point, roman and italic, with luxurious margins, Shakespeare's work has room to breathe on the page. It is a wonderful example of Mardersteig's exceptional work--both technically and aesthetically. Mardersteig 7; Ransom A5; Roderick Cave, The Private Press, 152-9.







An elegant volume printed in black in the Avon typeface and decorated with a full border (after the "histories" borders for the Vale Shakespeare) designed by Charles Ricketts and cut by Messrs. Knights and Cottrell. Printed on handmade paper with a distinct "mermaid" watermark by Messrs. Arnold. A lovely volume and one of the last printed by the Press. Watry B45.

Very light shelfwear including softening at the spine ends and bumped bottom corners; typical offsetting to the endpapers else free of the typical foxing so often found in this set; textblock is unopened. An elegant volume printed in black in the Avon typeface and decorated with a full border on the opening page and numerous half borders throughout designed by Charles Ricketts and cut by Messrs. Knights and Cottrell. Printed on handmade paper with a distinct "mermaid" watermark by Messrs. Arnold. A fantastic volume from a set that is among the most elegant and pleasing editions of Shakespeare's *Plays* with beautiful Art Nouveau influenced cover and borders. Watry B44/3.
