Intercession Team



Part of KGF's vision is to train men and women to engage in spiritual warfare that yields tangible results. For the past 8 years, KGF has been recruiting and training intercessors on a regular basis. The KGF intercessors team is comprised of men and women who have committed to pray until the will of God is done on earth as it is in heaven.

In 2018, we changed our meeting days from Saturday mornings to Friday evenings to ensure that all intercessors would be able to attend. The intercession meetings focused on training the intercessors on how to pray effectively. Pastor Beatrice always

exhorts the team that the strength of an intercessor is in knowing the will of God for what you are praying about. Intercessors need to consistently pray for their eyes to see, ears to hear and hearts to perceive the will of God.

Below are the main lessons shared by Gloire Kitenge, from his experience of being part of KGF's intercession team in 2018:

Hearing

As watchmen, we cannot be effective if we fail to perceive when God speaks. Being an intercessor without being equipped with the capacity to hear when God speaks is the same as going to war without a weapon.

Our Spiritual Sense

We should be able to hear, see, smell and touch in the spiritual realm in the same way we are able to hear, see, smell and touch in the natural realm. Intercessors who are spiritually blind or dead will never be effective in their prayer life.

God Size Faith

A God size mission can never be achieved with a human size faith. As intercessors, we are neither fighting our own battle nor are we engaged in the fight alone. The One who fights for us is God. A God size victory can only be experienced through a God size faith.

Annual Events


Prayer Workshop

One of the ways KGF strives to achieve its vision is through organising interactive workshops and training sessions for intercessors. We hosted our Annual Prayer Workshop on 21 July 2018 and the guest speaker was Pastor Tracy Nyamuda from Go Church in Centurion. The theme of the workshop was, 'The impact of effective intercession on society.'

Pastor Tracy taught participants on the dominion they possessed as children of God and how they could use intercession to positively influence the following domains of society:

- Education
- Church
- Government
- Business & Economics (including agriculture)
- Health, Science and Technology
- Media & Communication
- Arts, Entertainment and Sports
- Family

Annual Conference

The Annual Conference was concluded by a workshop titled: 'Can Prayer change God's mind.' The intercessors had an opportunity to engage with the panel; Bishop Tshalo Katshunga, Dr McPherson and Pastor Tracy Nyamuda. The content of the workshop was thought provoking and it helped intercessors to understand the difference between God's decree and God's declaration, which is very useful in intercession.

Fundraising


KGF occasionally runs fundraising campaigns in order to raise the required funds for conferences and workshops.


