



Pinhey Sand Dunes

Unique in all of Canada, these dunes, located just off Slack Road, contain an ecosystem dating from the last glacial period that ended 15 thousand years ago. Come and learn from scientists from Biodiversity Conservancy who have worked to restore sections of these dunes to their natural state to support the livelihood of over 200 species of insects, spiders and dune plants of which many are threatened with extirpation.
