**Rock Gardens**

A variety of plants from many different habitats can be used in rock gardens. Some plants have origins in the high mountains, while others originated at lower elevations. There are rock garden plants that need to be grown in close proximity to rocks in order to thrive and those that are simply attractive when grown with rock accents. Many rock garden plants are compact in size, making it an ideal style of gardening for those who have limited space. Below is a list of drought tolerant plants that will grow beautifully in an rock garden.

Common Name	Latin	Conditions
<b>Blue Fescue</b>	<i>Festuca glauca</i>	Full sun to part shade
<b>Yarrow</b>	<i>Achilla</i>	Full sun, deer resistant
<b>Hens and Chicks</b>	<i>Echeveria elegans</i>	Full sun to part shade
<b>Phlox</b>	<i>Phlox subulata</i>	Full sun to part shade, white variety
<b>Stonecrop</b>	<i>Sedum acre</i>	Full sun to part shade
<b>Woolly Thyme</b>	<i>Thymus pseudolanuginosus</i>	Full sun to part shade
<b>Saxifrage</b>	<i>Saxifraga bronchialis</i>	Full sun to part shade, evergreen in areas
<b>Lithodora</b>	<i>Lithodora prostrata</i>	Full sun to part shade, deer resistant
<b>Hardy Purple Ice Plant</b>	<i>Delosperma cooperi</i>	Full sun, needs good drainage
